## Sacred Heart Christmas Tea and Bazaar

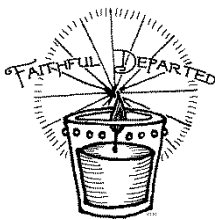

Sacred Heart. May our loved ones rest in the eternal light and peace of heaven!

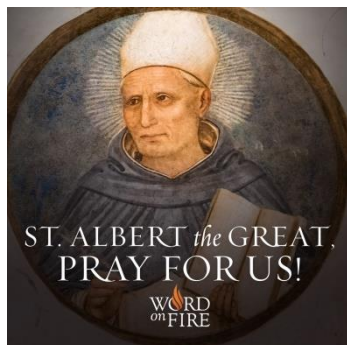
The **Book of Intentions** will be located by the Sacred Heart statue in the entryway during November. You are welcome to continue to write prayer intentions in this book.

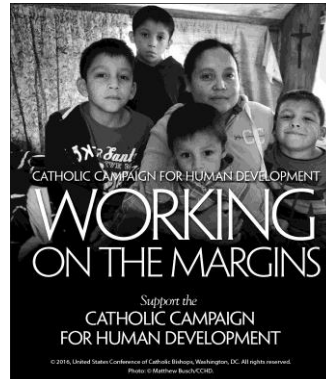
