May these sacrificial offerings, O Lord, become for you a pure oblation, and for us a holy outpouring of your mercy.

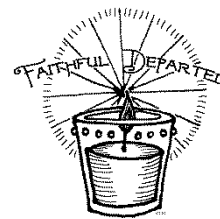
