## Empowering Catholic Churches and Ministries to Help the Poorest of the Poor Worldwide

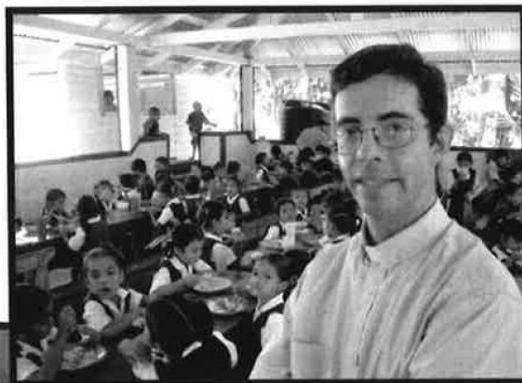
