THE SOLEMNITY OF OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST, KING OF THE UNIVERSE



On November 26th we celebrate the Feast of Christ the King. It is one of many opportunities the Catholic Liturgical Church year offers each of us to consider the creature which is called time, receive it as a gift and begin to really live differently. Yet, for many Catholics who commemorate the Feast, it is just one more somewhat esoteric celebration which we go through every year at this time. This mistake is at least right on one count, it really is all about time. The Catholic Christian notion of receiving time as a gift from God is one of the many things which make us counter-cultural. In fact, the number of things which make us counter-

cultural is increasing as the West abandons its foundations in Christendom and embraces a secularist delusion.

The Church really IS the Mystical Body of the Risen Christ. That Body is inseparably joined to the Head. Jesus Christ is alive, he has been raised, and he continues His redemptive mission now through the Church, of which we are members. As we choose to actually live our lives liturgically, not just go through the motions, we can move through life in the flow of the liturgical calendar. We can experience the deeper mystery and meaning of life, now made New in Jesus Christ, the One who is “the Way, the Truth and the Life” (John 14:6). Jesus Christ is King! Jesus Christ is meant to become the Lord of our whole lives, and inform the very pattern of how we live them.
