The Feast of the Holy Family

The Christian family is the first cell of the whole Church. It is the place where we begin the journey toward holiness and become more fully human. From antiquity the Christian family has been called a "domestic church." In our family we can learn the way of selfless love by following the example of the Holy Family. In the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph, we learn the way of love in the School of Nazareth.

In a beautiful address on December 28, 2011, at his Wednesday audience, Pope Benedict XVI spoke of the life of the Holy Family in Nazareth in this way:

"The house of the Holy Family in Nazareth is a school of prayer where we learn to listen, to meditate, to penetrate the deepest meaning of the manifestation of the Son of God, drawing our example from Mary, Joseph and Jesus. The Holy Family is an icon of the domestic Church, which is called to pray together. The family is the first school of prayer where, from their infancy, children learn to perceive God thanks to the teaching and example of their parents. An authentically Christian education cannot neglect the experience of prayer. If we do not learn to pray in the family, it will be difficult to fill this gap later. I would, then, like to invite people to rediscover the beauty of praying together as a family, following the school of the Holy Family of Nazareth".

Family is where progress in the spiritual life finds its raw material. Whether we choose to respond to grace - and develop the eyes to see, ears to hear, and hearts to accept the hidden invitations to learn to love beneath the surface of that daily "stuff" - is all wrapped up in the mystery of human freedom. Our choices not only affect the world around us, they make us become the people we will become.

As Pope Benedict XVI reminded the faithful, "In this life of responding to the Lord's invitations we are gradually transformed into an image of Jesus Christ." This way of holiness is not easy, but make no mistake, it is a very real path to holiness. It is also a wonderful one.

Through those choices presented to us from the moment we open our eyes every morning to the time we close them at night, we are invited to learn in the "School of Nazareth" and, in imitation of the Holy Family, become a domestic church, learning to love, pray and grow in holiness.

The first school of prayer and practice, the place where we learn Christian way of life, is the first cell of the Church, the domestic church of the Christian family.

Bring prayer in your family, bring it to your little children. Teach them to pray. For a child that prays is a happy child. A family that prays is a united family.
