## Lenten Regulations

**FAST AND ABSTINENCE** (self-denial). To foster the spirit of penance and of reparation for sin, to encourage self-denial, and to guide us in the footsteps of Jesus, Church law requires the observance of fast and abstinence (CCC 1249-1253).

**1. Abstinence:** All persons who have already celebrated their 14<sup>th</sup> birthday are bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent.

**2. Fasting:** Everyone, from the celebration of their 18<sup>th</sup> birthday to their 59<sup>th</sup> birthday, is bound to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Voluntary fasting on other weekdays of Lent, especially on Wednesdays and Fridays, is highly recommended. Fasting is generally understood to mean eating one full meal each day. Two other partial meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken; but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids are allowed.

Thank you for your unshakeable faith in an imperfect church that tries each day through its humble leadership and diocesan ministries to imitate Christ.
