The Sacred Paschal Triduum

The Sacred Paschal Triduum is the summit of the Church's year. The Triduum begins with the evening Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday, reaches its high point in the Easter Vigil, and closes with Evening Prayer on Easter Sunday. Though chronologically three days, they are liturgically one day unfolding for us the unity of Christ's Paschal Mystery.

Holy Thursday of the Lord's Supper

(7:00pm Sacred Heart, Baudette)

The evening Mass on Holy Thursday is referred to as The Mass of the Lord's Supper. This is where the Church relives the institution of the Eucharist and the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass at the Last Supper, as well as the institution of the priesthood, which took place the evening before Jesus was crucified.

After the homily there is an optional washing of the feet ceremony, where the priest washes the feet of others to signify his role as servant, just as Jesus did with his disciples. Extra hosts are consecrated at this Mass to be used on Good Friday when no Mass will be celebrated.

The Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday concludes with a procession of the Blessed Sacrament to the "altar of repose," a place where the consecrated host is kept other than the main altar where Mass is normally celebrated.

Good Friday of the Passion of the Lord

(3:00pm St. Mary's, Warroad; 7:00pm Sacred Heart, Baudette)

Good Friday is a mandatory day of fasting and abstinence. This is the day of the crucifixion, the day Jesus died for the sins of the world. The parish altar looks very different on Good Friday, it is plain and bare. There is no consecrated Host in the Tabernacle at the main altar of the church; it was carried away on Holy Thursday night to the "altar of repose" to signify Jesus' death. The candle by the Tabernacle is blown out, and the Tabernacle doors are left open to show that it is empty.

The ceremony on Good Friday is not a Mass, but rather a communion service using the consecrated hosts from Holy Thursday. Veneration of the Cross also takes place at this service, processing before a cross and either touching it or kissing it.

Holy Saturday's Easter Vigil

(8:30pm St. Mary's, Warroad)

The Easter Vigil, is the most glorious, beautiful, and dramatic liturgy for the Church.

The vigil is divided into four parts: 1) the service of light, during which we rejoice in Christ the light of the world coming to save us. 2) the liturgy of the Word, during which we are reminded through Sacred Scripture of God's saving actions since the beginning of time. 3) the liturgy of Baptism, during this the Easter water is blessed, new members are brought into the Church through baptism and the faithful are blessed with water and all renew their baptismal promises. and 4) the liturgy of the Eucharist.

Easter Sunday

(7:00am St. Joseph's, Williams; 8:30am St. Mary's, Warroad; 10:30am Sacred Heart Baudette)

Easter Sunday is what we've all been waiting for! The 40 days of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving during Lent was in preparation for this day, when our hearts and souls can drink in deeply the culmination of the Pascal mystery: the Resurrection.

"Easter is not simply one feast among others, but the 'Feast of feasts', the 'Solemnity of solemnities', just as the Eucharist is the 'Sacrament of sacraments'. St. Athanasius calls Easter 'the Great Sunday' and the Eastern Churches call Holy Week 'the Great Week'. The mystery of the Resurrection, in which Christ crushed death, permeates with its powerful energy our old time, until all is subjected to him." (CCC #1168, 1169)
