The Archdiocese of Verapoly is situated in Kerala, the Southwest State of India, sticking out into Arabian Sea. It is one of the first Catholic Dioceses of India, erected in 1886. The Archdiocese has:

## PROJECTS OF OUR MISSION IN INDIA THAT NEED REGULAR FUNDING AND YOUR KIND HELP:

**The Education of Seminarians:** We are blessed with many vocations to Priesthood and Religious Life. At present we have nearly 250 seminarians in various seminaries preparing themselves to be priests. This is my special request for those seminarians who need financial and spiritual support to complete their seminary formation and studies.

**Catechetical Formation :** We have developed a Sunday school system to catechize the children and the youth, Priests, Deacons and other trained catechists who try their level best to nourish our younger generation with the basic doctrines of the Catholic faith.

**Give them A Home:** It is the housing project for the homeless. There are thousands of families with no proper shelter. They live in shabby huts thatched with palm leaves. They need rethatching every year due to heavy monsoon rains. The recurring expenses to mend them, keep these families in abject poverty and misery. The condition never allows them to rise above their sub-human level of existence. They look up to the Church for help. We build houses for this people with a low cost of \$3000 each.

**Health Care Programs:** The primary Health Care Centers teach and supervise the basic medical hygiene of the poor in the villages and islands, which form the major part of Archdiocese. As the country does not have any health care insurance scheme or Federal Government aided Medicare or Medicaid system, the poor depend solely on these Health Care Centers where the services/treatments and the medicines are provided for free or just for nominal registration fee. This project has been a huge financial liability for the mission every year.

**Empowerment of the Women-Folk:** in most of the remote villages of India, women-folk is still looked down upon. Most of them are home-bound. So we have formed some self-help groups for women and help them to start small scale industries and other manual labours. Thus we try to direct the women folk into the main stream of the society. The funding for this project is done mainly from the mission appeal collections.

**Rain Water Harvest Program:** Due to the acute scarcity of drinking water, we have recently started this project. We build a small concrete container and store the rain water and four to five families share this water only to drink.

**Self-Employment through Vocational Training:** Committed Religious Brothers and Nuns are working in these facilities, who also train the Youth and adults for self-employment through vocational training. About 2500 are getting trained under this program every year.

**Orphanages and Nursing Home for the Aged:** Many of the children in the orphanages could have been aborted, but for these institutions .Because of the strong traditional family values, we have only as few as 400 old and abandoned in the home for the aged as the country has no welfare scheme to look after them.

**Up-keep of the Catholic Grade Schools and High Schools:** As elementary and secondary school education are to be provided by the management as per country's law; these educational buildings such as schools, colleges and hostels, though very pristine in nature cost heavily for their maintenance. Schools and colleges give us ample opportunity for evangelization and catechetical work. This makes it necessary and urgent for us to upkeep them despite heavy financial burdens.
