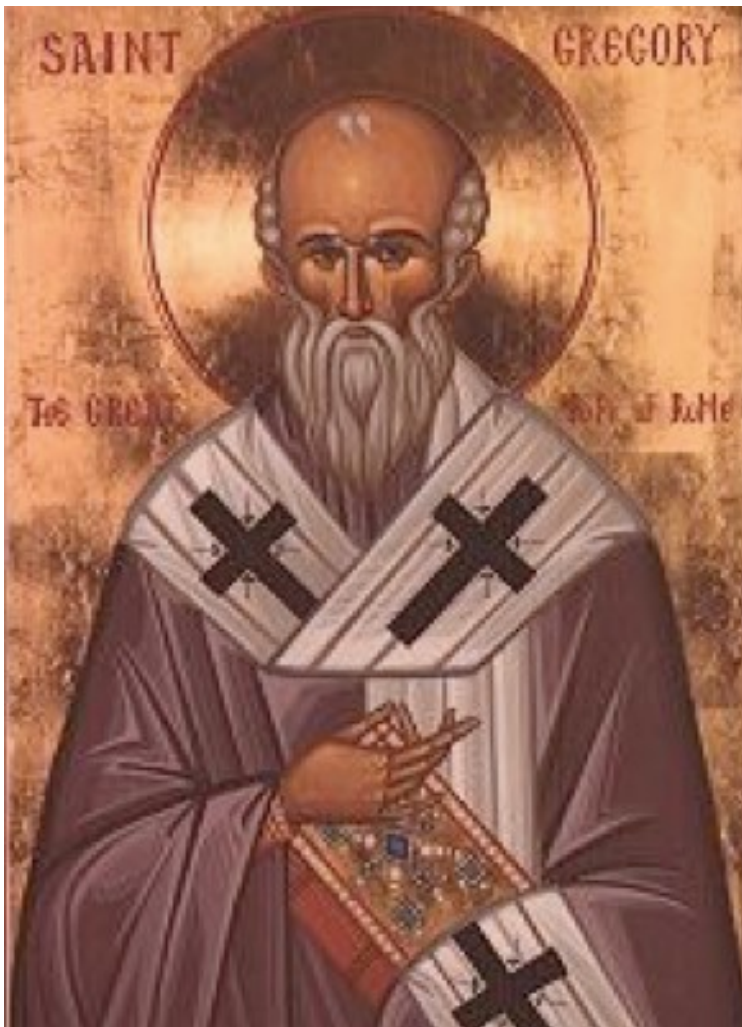

Pope St. Gregory the Great

Feast Day September 3

Pope 590-604AD

Through his preaching and teaching Pope St. Gregory the Great gifted the Church and world in numerous ways.

He had a great love for the poor and less fortunate and called on the church to look always to serving those in need.

His book, *Pastoral Care*, on the duties and qualities of a bishop, described bishops as physicians of the soul and was read for centuries after his death.

Pope St. Gregory the Great is credited with being the first pope to take on the title: "The Servant of the Servants of God." A title that every pope since him has used.

He led a reform of the liturgy and is often credited with the renewal of "Gregorian" Chant.

He had great evangelical zeal and sent missionaries to many points of the globe to share the message of Christ.

In his own down-to-earth preaching, Gregory was skilled at applying the daily Gospel to the needs of his listeners.

Pope St. Gregory the Great was immersed in Sacred Scripture, knowing and teaching that by immersing ourselves in the Bible we begin to know both who we are and who we can be through the grace and mercy of God.

"The Holy Bible is like a mirror before our mind's eye. In it we see our inner face. From the Scriptures we can learn our spiritual deformities and beauties. And there too we discover the progress we are making and how far we are from perfection."

Pope St Gregory the Great
