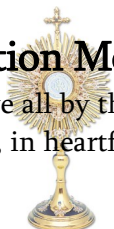

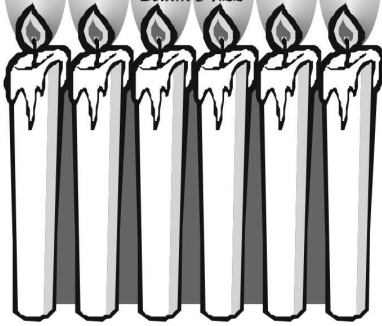

All Saints Day

*The Lord redeems the life of
his servants;
none of those who take refuge
in him will be condemned.*

Psalms 34:22



Christians have been honoring saints and martyrs since the very beginning of the Church. There are thousands of canonized saints, individuals officially recognized by the Church as holy men and women worthy of our imitation. We can be assured they are prime examples of holiness, and powerful intercessors before God on our behalf.

The Church celebrates the saints throughout the year on various saint days, but the Solemnity of All Saints is when the Church honors every saint, known and unknown. While we have information about many saints, and we honor them on specific days, there are many unknown or unsung saints, who may have been forgotten, or never been honored specifically. On All Saints Day, we celebrate these holy individuals, and ask for their prayers and intercessions.

The Solemnity of All Saints Day is connected to the doctrine of The Communion of Saints. This is the Catholic teaching that all of God's people, on heaven, earth, and in Purgatory, are connected and united. In other words, we know in faith that the saints of God are just as alive as those of us on earth, and are constantly interceding on our behalf.

The Catholic Catechism describes this communion among believers, by which we are connected to Christ, and thus to one another:

"Being more closely united to Christ, those who dwell in heaven fix the whole Church more firmly in holiness...They do not cease to intercede with the Father for us..." (CCC 956).

"...as Christian communion among our fellow pilgrims brings us closer to Christ, so our communion with the saints joins us to Christ, from whom as from its fountain and head issues all grace, and the life of the People of God itself: We worship Christ as God's Son; we love the martyrs as the Lord's disciples and imitators, and rightly so because of their matchless devotion towards their king and master. May we also be their companions and fellow disciples (CCC 957)!

Remember, our connection with the saints in heaven is one grounded in a tight-knit communion. Because of our common communion with and through Jesus Christ, our prayers are joined with the heavenly community of Christians.
