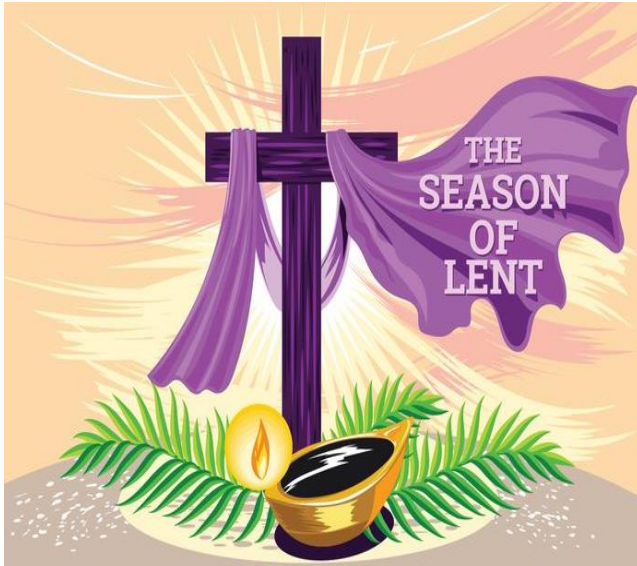

### **Vatican modifies Distribution of Ashes on Ash Wednesday**

Next Wednesday, February 17<sup>th</sup> is Ash Wednesday, which marks the beginning of the holy season of lent. Here in our three parishes, we shall have Mass at 8: 30 am and 7: 15 pm in St. Mary's, Warroad and 5: 15 pm in Sacred Heart, Baudette. Due to the health situation caused by Covid-19, distributing ashes on the forehead of each person is problematic this year. The Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments published a note instructing priests to follow the ancient and common practice found in Rome and in a number of countries where ashes are sprinkled on the head. The person receiving the ashes should kneel or make a deep bow when receiving the ashes. The priest or a minister assisting with the distribution will sprinkle the ashes on each person's head without saying anything.
