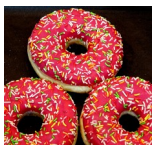

### Education Corner

#### A Gift Freely Given

Bishop Cozzens describes the Eucharist as wanting to "catechize us about the essence of the Christian life" (<https://www.eucharisticrevival.org/post/the-spiritual-life-how-the-eucharist-catechizes-about-the-meaning-of-life>). We've heard before that it is the source and summit of our lives. He explains that "The Eucharist is not only a place to encounter Jesus and receive his life, the source, but also the place where we give him ourselves in worship, the summit" (emphasis added). He goes on to say, "To my mind, this sacrificial aspect of the Eucharist is very much neglected in our catechesis, perhaps even more neglected than the Church's teaching on the Real Presence." Now, sacrifice is one of those words in our culture that ranks right up there with diet, and exercise. In the back of our minds we know how important these things are, but they are synonymous with pain and effort; not anything anyone really looks forward to. What he's telling us is that we're not teaching people how to make their entire lives a gift to God. Gift, now that's a word that gets everyone's attention! It's offered freely. It's given out of love. We all like to give gifts that are appreciated by the receiver because it makes us happy. Consider what Bishop Cozzens is saying, "None of us will be happy unless we learn to make a gift of ourselves."

## To Go up Higher: Scott Hahn Reflects on the Twenty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

Readings:

[Sirach 3:17-18, 20, 28-29](#)

We come to the wedding banquet of heaven by way of humility and charity. This is the fatherly instruction we hear in today's First Reading, and the message of today's Gospel.

Jesus is not talking simply about good table manners. He is revealing the way of the kingdom, in which the one who would be greatest would be the servant of all (see Luke 22:24-27).

This is the way, too, that the Father has shown us down through the ages—filling the hungry, sending the rich away empty, lifting up the lowly, pulling down the proud (see Luke 1:52-53).

We again call to mind the Exodus in today's Psalm—how in His goodness the Lord led the Israelites from imprisonment to prosperity, rained down bread from heaven, made them His inheritance, becoming a “Father of orphans.”

We now have also gained a share of His inheritance. We are to live humbly, knowing we are not worthy to receive from His table (see Luke 6:7; 15:21). We are to give alms, remembering we were ransomed from sin by the price of His blood (see I Corinthians 6:19-20).

The Lord promises that if we are humble we will be exalted and find favor with God; that if we are kind to those who can never repay us, we will atone for sins and find blessing in the resurrection of the righteous.

We anticipate the fulfillment of those promises in every Eucharist, today's Epistle tells us. In the Mass, we enter the festal gathering of the angels and the firstborn children of God. It is the liturgy of the heavenly Jerusalem in which Jesus is the high priest, the King who calls us to come up higher (see Proverbs 25:6-7).
