### **S.H. Parish Council Sept. 11, 2022**

Fr. Andrew presented the results of the Disciple Maker Survey and led discussion concerning areas of interest. The reestablishment of "women's groups" was discussed with the agreement that they would be welcome with the idea that there are established purposes and constitutions that would govern them. Educational opportunities are planned for all members (young and mature) in the near future. The "Formed" online programs are available for our diocese and will be studied by 6th Graders through Adults while the 1st -5th Graders will receive corresponding packets. Plans were discussed for the possibility of a St. Blaise Blessing of the Throats. The Rosary will be prayed 1/2 hour prior to mass starting in October. Pastoral Council Members will initiate personal contact with our parish community members via phone and mail. Names will be divided at our next meeting on Oct. 30 after mass.

### Education Corner

#### At the Foot of the Cross

It's hard to say this more plainly than Bishop Cozzens has said in his article *The Spiritual Life: How the Eucharist Catechizes about the Meaning of Life* ([www.eucharisticrevival.org](http://www.eucharisticrevival.org)). So we quote his Lessons

from *Our Lady at the Foot of the Cross*: "Why does Christ make his sacrificial death present in the Mass? So that we can join in it. To understand this, let us ask a question: What is Our Lady doing at the foot of the Cross? Why is she present there? What does she see? What is happening in her heart? At Calvary, many people were there as spectators, some were there only to mock. Very few there knew what was going on -- that Jesus was offering his life for the salvation of the world. Mary was not there as a spectator."

Certainly not! In fact, a mother's love would have wanted to stop what was happening to her son; to protect him from suffering. But her love was tempered with the knowledge that her son was the Son of God and as such he had a specific purpose and mission for his life. She must have felt every blow nearly as keenly as Jesus did. That's the way it is for mothers. Mary was certainly not there as a spectator. So, why was she there?

## Formed!

As baptized members of the Body of Christ, we are each called to be evangelists. In order to share our faith with those around us, we need to constantly grow in our own faith, so that we can share it more effectively. "Formed" is a great source of material to help us deepen our faith, and learn about Church teachings, and beliefs. ## Prudent Stewards: Scott Hahn Reflects on the Twenty-Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Readings:  
Amos 8:4-7  
Psalm 113:1-2, 4-6, 7-8  
1 Timothy 2:1-8  
Luke 16:1-13

The steward in today's Gospel confronts the reality that he can't go on living the way he has been. He is under judgment. He must give account for what he has done.

The exploiters of the poor in today's First Reading are also about to be pulled down, to be thrust from their stations (see Isaiah 22:19). Servants of mammon, or money, they're so in love with wealth that they reduce the poor to objects; they despise the new moons and sabbaths—the observances and holy days of God (see Leviticus 23:24; Exodus 20:8).

Their only hope is to follow the steward's path. He is no model of repentance. But he makes a prudent calculation—to use his last hours in charge of his master's property to show mercy to others, to relieve their debts.

He is a child of this world, driven by a purely selfish motive—to make friends and be welcomed into the homes of his master's debtors. Yet his prudence is commended as an example to us, the children of light (see 1 Thessalonians 5:5; Ephesians 5:8). We too must realize, as the steward does, that what we have is not honestly ours, but in truth belongs to another, our Master.

All the mammon in the world could not have paid the debt we owe our Master. So He paid it for us. He gave His life as a ransom for all, as we hear in today's Epistle.

God wants everyone to be saved, even kings and princes, even the lovers of money (see Luke 16:14). But we cannot serve two Masters. By His grace, we should choose to be, as we sing in today's Psalm, "servants of the Lord."

We serve Him by using what He has entrusted us with to give alms, to lift the lowly from the dust and dunghills of this world. By this we will gain what is ours and be welcomed into eternal dwellings, the many mansions of the Father's house (see John 14:2).
